







Scope and Sequence: Fast ForWord Reading Readiness

Coaster 	Match consonant sounds to letters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Phonemic awareness • Letter-sound correspondence
Houndini 	Listen to four words and identify the one with a different beginning, middle, or ending sound	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Phonemic awareness • Letter-sound correspondence • Vocabulary
